The MacKenzie Art Gallery and Regina Downtown Business Improvement District invite you to encounter **art{outside}**.

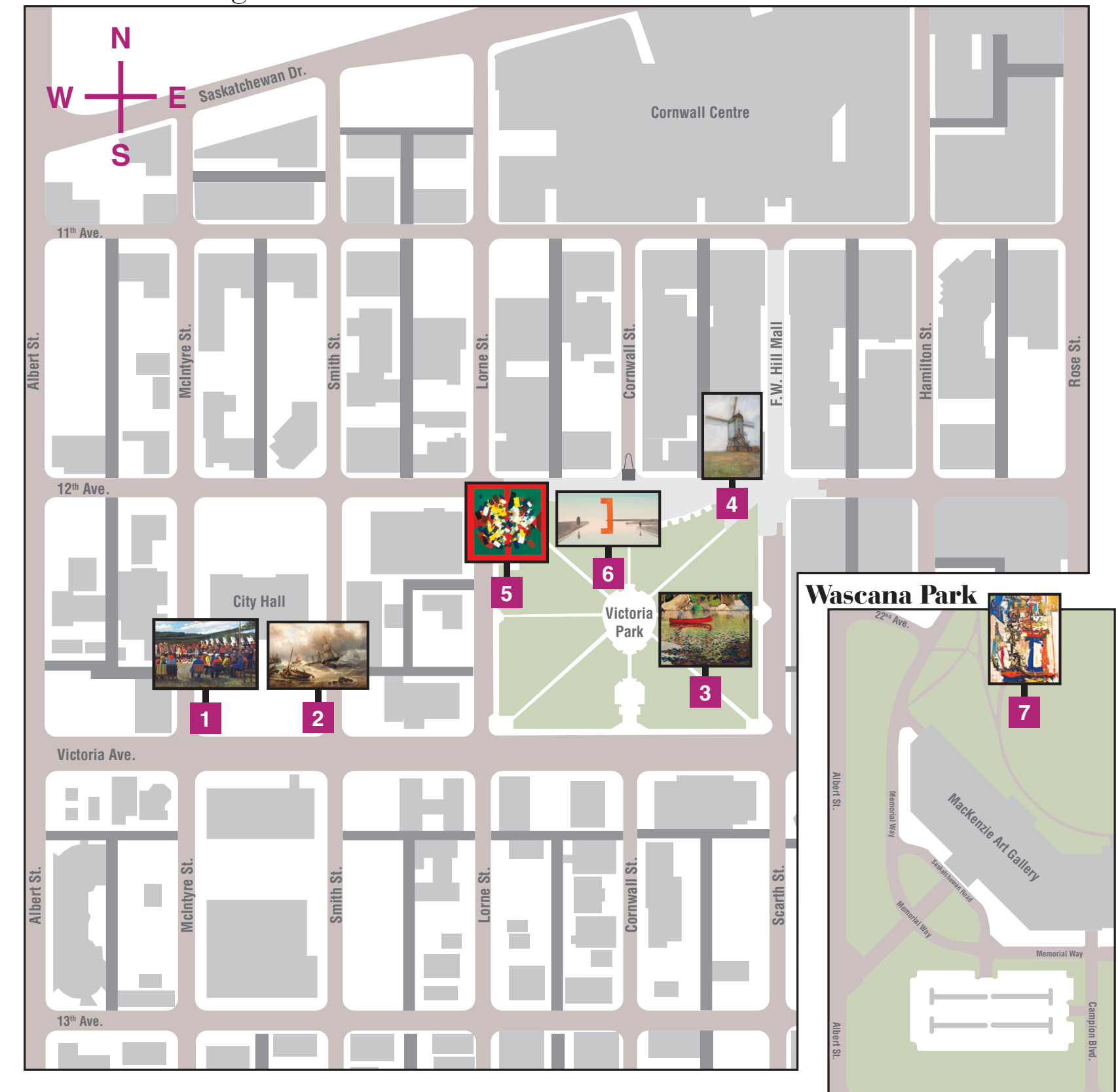
